

## Flexible Sigmoidoscopy (Flex Sig) Patient Instructions

Your Appointment has been scheduled for a Flexible Sigmoidoscopy in the Endoscopy Lab on the 2nd floor of the Ochsner Clinic at 1514 Jefferson Highway in New Orleans. Take elevator B to the 2nd floor of the clinic and follow the signs to the outpatient surgery area.

This is a procedure to view the inside of your lower digestive tract (colon and rectum). It can help screen for colon cancer and can also help find the source of abdominal pain, bleeding and changes in bowel habits. If necessary, your doctor may need to take samples during the procedures.

# Designated Driver on the Day of Your Exam

A responsible adult (family member or friend) must come with you to your colonoscopy and remain in the endoscopy area until you are discharged. You are not allowed to drive, take a taxi or bus, or leave the Endoscopy center alone. If you do not have a responsible adult (friend or family) with you to take you home, your exam will be cancelled.

### **Key Instructions:**

 Your bowel must be empty so that your doctor can clearly view your colon. Follow all of the instructions in this handout exactly as they are written

#### Medications and What to Do

Some of the medicines you take may need to be stopped adjusted before your Flexible Sigmoidoscopy.

Medication	What to Do
Anticoagulant/blood thinning medication	Follow the instructions from the scheduling
Aggrenox, ASA, Brilinta, Effient, Eliquis,	nurse
Lovenox, Plavix, Pletal, Pradaxa, Ticilid, Xarelto	
Coumadin through Ochsner's Coumadin Clinic	Follow the instructions from the Coumadin

Blood pressure, heart, anti-rejection, and/or	Take your regular dose by 6:00 AM the
seizure medication	morning of your colonoscopy appointment
Insulin or other oral medication for diabetes	Skip your dose the morning of the procedure,

	and bring your diabetic medications with you
	to the colonoscopy
Any other medications	Follow the instructions from the scheduling

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If you are a female under the age of 60 years of age, please be prepared to provide a urine sample on arrival.

If you have questions about the cost of the procedure, you should contact your health insurance company as soon as possible. Please bring a picture Id and your insurance card. You will have to sign a treatment authorization forms at check in. It is necessary for you to sign these forms again even if you recently signed these at the time of your clinic visit.
